# Office Space Leasing

Another way to go would be to lease a house and set-up your team there. This would start being cost-effective for teams of more than 20 members. As with every piece of information in this ebook, leasing prices vary widely by city and even by neighborhood within the city. For practical purposes we researched the city of Guadalajara, known as the *Mexican Silicon Valley* and we focus on averaging the areas where most software developing companies are established.

### Electricity Cost

Range between **\$0.038 and \$0.096 USD per Kwh**

A good internet connection range between **\$150 and \$200 USD per month.**

## Set-up Costs

### **Setup Package: \$5,000 (One-Time Fee)**

#### What's Included?

1. Register the company name and file the draft deed of incorporation online.
2. Register to the Mexican Social Security Institute.
3. Sign the deed of incorporation with a Public Notary.
4. Obtain Tax Registry Number (RFC).
5. File the deed of incorporation with the Public Register of Commerce.
6. Register with the local tax administration.
7. Register with the National Business Information Registry.
8. Obtain the authorization for the company name from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
9. Register the company statutes with the Public Registry of Commerce.
10. Obtain operational license.

Mandatory Legal Annual Compliance: \$4,000 (Annual Fee)

Privacy Notice: \$800 (per event)

Know-Your-Customer Process: \$120 (per event)

Secretary Non-member of the Board: \$1,200 (Annual Fee)
